A Word From Public Works

With fall here, the Public Works department would like to remind you that the city will be picking up leaf bags. **Do not rake your leaves into or place your leaf bags in the gutter or out into the street, as this can clog the storm drains.** Please place the bags on the curb or edge of your property—sooner, rather than later—and they will be collected as soon as possible.

Also, please remember to winterize your sprinkler systems to keep them in good shape for next spring.
