## Taking the Roundabout Way

With a busy summer in full swing the 100 North roundabout is as busy as ever. Below are a few reminders when driving in a two-lane roundabout.

- Do NOT change lanes once inside the roundabout, stay within the lane without cutting the corner or drifting into the other lane.
- The outside lane is for right turns and going straight through the roundabout.
- Do not stop once you are inside the roundabout unless you are yielding to pedestrians or emergency vehicles.
- Please follow all traffic signs and drive through the roundabout at no more than the posted speed of 15 miles per hour

## Talking Trash

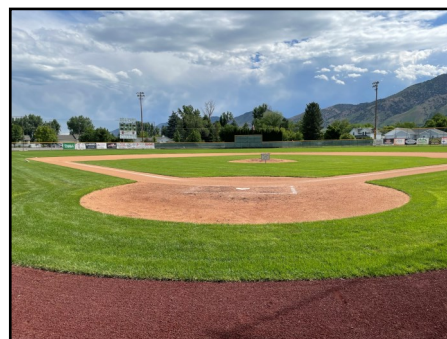
With several changes going on across Cache Valley, we have gotten a lot of calls and questions from residents on the garbage situation in Providence.

Providence is in the process of starting its own waste collection program. Our garbage trucks have been ordered and the steps are all in place. However, this all takes time. We are aiming to have our system up and running late next spring or early summer. In the meantime, your garbage, recycling and green waste will continue to be picked up on its regular schedule through Logan City. Once we switch to our own collection system, garbage, recycling and green waste will all still be picked up.
